Respected Abraham Bray

In conformity

with my last letter I write again for your

Grandmother, she and your Parents being

wishful to render you assistance, they send

you a Twenty pound Bank of England note

payable on demand N^o [symbol: 2 small circles, one above the other]09775 and dated 22

July 1841. On acct of it do not let a post escape

before you answer either to your father or your

Grandmother or both of them. I hope before this

you have seen or heard from James Richardson

who has your directions with him.

M^{rs} Richardson hopes to hear

from James soon and hope he will be able to

say he has met with you. As to news have

very little to say Times remain very dull and

many out of employment [i.e. employment]. When you write again

give a real good direction that letters may be
sure to find you. Your Grandmother enjoys
excellent [inserted above: health] and by a letter from Ireland they
are all well –
